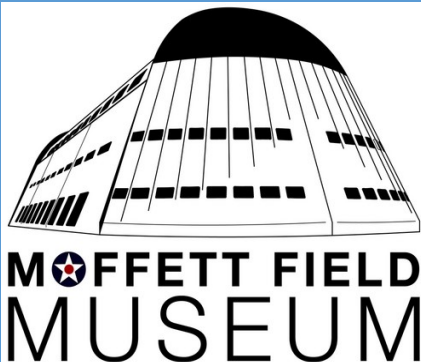

## **A Chaplain's Message at Easter**

*As we have entered into the Easter season, I have been thinking about how most of us view Easter traditions, the Easter Bunny, colored eggs, and Easter bonnet and maybe an Easter dress to wear to Sunday services.*

*I do believe in giving Christmas presents and I do think children should have an Easter basket. Most of us love chocolate, and I don't believe we begrudge any child or adult the delight of eating that chocolate egg or bunny. But our social practices around such important holidays deserve to be held in moderation. Does the Easter Bunny teach children anything about the meaning of Lent or the Resurrection?*

*Traditions of the Easter holiday that are most important to our faith are gathering together in worship, sharing an Easter meal, hearing the message of Christ's Resurrection and rejoicing in Jesus' victory over death! I think it is appropriate to say "Happy Easter!" But it is our responsibility as Christians who celebrate Easter to remind the rest of the World why we celebrate Christ's death and Resurrection, just as we celebrate his birth at Christmas.*

*Easter is more than an opportunity to wear new Spring fashion. Easter is more than one day of Easter Sunday. Easter is a season of fifty days, the second longest liturgical season, where we continue to celebrate the Resurrection until the feast of Pentecost. FYI, Easter is always the first Sunday after the first full moon of the Spring equinox.*

*As we live into this Easter season, may we focus hearts and minds on the good news of the Resurrection. May we share the good news with grateful and joyful hearts, leaping forward like children on an egg hunt, eagerly searching for the presence of Christ in our own lives and accepting the gift of his Resurrection as fully as our Easter baskets.*

## **Meet our Post's new Chaplain, Mike Brodick**

*Mike was born in Hayward, California, the eldest of 3. His dad, Aloysious Brodick, was a WWII Army veteran, salesman, and cab driver. Mom Jeanne was a bookkeeper and seamstress. "My grandfather Joe, from Lisbon, Portugal, taught me how to drive at the age of 12 years, behind the wheel of a 1949 Chevy truck, on his dairy farm in Patterson, California." Mike now owns a similar Chevy truck, same vintage.*

*Mike, a US Army Vietnam Veteran, attended Catholic schools, including attending St Mary's College. He also holds an MBA from University of Phoenix, and is currently enrolled in a Doctorate program at Grand Canyon University. He has been married to his wife Paula for 49 years — they have two children and two grandchildren. He has worked in Logistics and Material management for over 40 years, with companies such as Facebook, Google, Yahoo, and Network Appliance.*

*Mike is the president and founder of the 501 c3 nonprofit organization, "Simply Good Works Inc." "I was donating to veteran charities as early as 2010. Friends encouraged me to start my own nonprofit — I needed a name for it. One Sunday, our priest ended his sermon with the challenge, 'Go out and do something good today.' Over breakfast, we were talking about simple acts of kindness. A few moments later I said, 'Well I guess Simply Good Does Work!' Since 2011 we've donated to a number of veteran's charities, raising money and providing mobility equipment for veterans and their families. We work with Almaden Lion's Club, the Moose Fraternity, and the American Legion to provide assistance to those in need. Mike is a member of the American Legion, is appearing at our Post 419 lounge, in the duet "Just Us," with Ron Papes. Catch them on 2nd and 4th Fridays, 3:30 to 6:30pm.*

Post 419 was honored to be represented by Andrew Lei, a Bellarmine College Preparatory student, in the 2026 American Legion Oratorical Competition. Originating in 1938, the American Legion High School Oratorical Contest is a program of The American Legion that gives high school students the opportunity to compete for college scholarships in a “Constitutional Speech Contest.”

Through their involvement, high school students cultivate their communication skills as they develop a deeper knowledge and understanding of the U.S. Constitution.

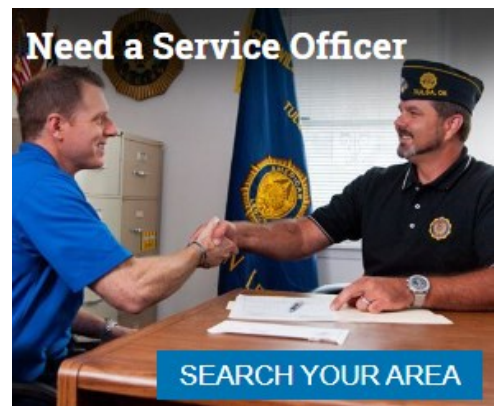
Participants also grow in leadership ability, their capacity to think and speak clearly and intelligently, and understanding of the rights, responsibilities, obligations and privileges of U.S. citizens.

Andrew returned to the competition in 2026 after placing second in the Area 2 competition in 2025, representing Post 419. This year he was unchallenged at the Post level, finished first in District, first in Area 2, and second at the Department of California level.

The competition consists of delivering an 8-10 minute prepared speech on some aspect of the U.S. Constitution. Emphasis is placed on the attendant duties and obligations of a citizen to our government, related to one-of-four topics stated in the rules. Additionally, a 3-5 minute assigned topic speech (with just 5 minutes of preparation) must be delivered. Andrew chose the Authorization for use of Military Force and the Constitution’s separation and balance of war powers for his prepared topic. He met both goals, delivering clear, concise, and compelling orations.

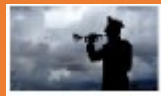

Should you forget or lose your card you can access a copy on line at the same site, saving you time. Should you renew at our Post, please pay by check! It is more secure than loose cash and gives your Membership Committee a second check on the spelling of your name. Remember the "coveted 'Early Bird' stamp will be stamped on your 2026 Membership Card to those members renewing prior to Veterans Day. Please note: Anyone applying for new membership, or that is transferring from the California at large Post 1000, you must submit a copy of your DD-214. Active Duty applicants need to provide a proof of Active Duty. Feel free to black out or redact your Social Security number, we also will return it once your membership is approved. We cannot process or approve either without your DD-214, current military ID or Leave and Earnings Statement. Please remember to write your membership number on your check, or if renewing at the Post write it on the membership renewal and/or application (print CLEARLY), you can always just print a copy of your card and include it. This is not necessary if you use the form sent to you in the mail as your card number is already printed on it.
