Adjutant Report

Here we are at the beginning of another year. Two Thousand Twenty Four (2024) we have survived almost another quarter of a century. I can remember when it took the longest time to get from New Years Day to Christmas Day, now it is only a few months (moments) apart. A lot of work has to be done in a short time, which means there is not enough time to get it all done unless you have help. In the past there seemed to be a lot of participation in running the operation of Post 419 but this has fallen to just a few who have been doing the work for years at a time. New help needs to step up and take the reins for the post, for the everyday administration and finance work, yard work, assist with facility maintenance. Those of us who are currently doing these tasks are getting to a point where we are unable to do them. I took a look at our roster from the beginning of December 2023 and there are only about 34 current members under the approximate age of 70. We have to do a better job of recruiting the current veterans to join The American Legion Post 419. Just as a reminder Post 419 had 18 members transferred to Post Everlasting in 2023, that we know of.

We currently show 25 WWII veterans registered members 2024 (age group 95 and UP), 135 VIETNAM ERA veterans registered members 2024 (ages between 70 and 100), 7 UNKNOWN ERA veterans registered 2024 (age group unknown), 10 PERSIAN GULF ERA veterans registered members 2024 (ages between 50 and 70), 6 PANAMA ERA veterans registered members 2024 (ages between 45 and 50), and 11 listed in the OTHERS category this gives us a total pf 194+ veterans registered members 2024 so far. I ask again if you have not renewed your membership yet please do.

Again a reminder effective June 30, 2024 I will be stepping down as the Post 419 Adjutant. Some of the duties of the adjutant are simple however there are others which need a few months training in specialized computer application training. We need someone to step up in the next few weeks to start training.

Some of the applications that you will need to be familiar with are the Windows Office application. Word, Excel, and Publisher and some Power Point. The critical application is the 'MyLegion' from AL National, in order to input new and renewal members and establish membership lists to name a few.

Thank all of you who have submitted your membership renewal and also to those of you who have chosen to become Paid Up for Life (PUFL) members this past year.

Funerals: Emotions run deep, last minute paperwork...I know

Suicide: We lose 22 Veterans each day to suicide...I'm not one today...I know

Faith: I've experienced the power of Grace...I know

Love: It exists...look into a Veterans Eyes...I Know

To understand a Veteran is to understand Love. Love for something that we didn't know we had within us. Some may be lost in thought or other influences...but we GI's took an oath to serve and protect. **We Know.**
