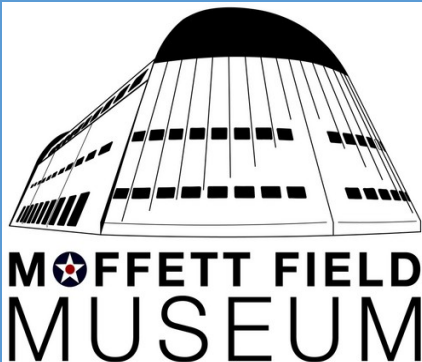

We receive no government funding. We rely on donations, income from hall rentals, and income from post events to operate. To date the revenues and thus the reserves are alarmingly low.

Post 419 was chartered by the American Legion Department of California in 1932. We owe our continued operation to those that have gone before us. Thank you for all you did and we hope to continue your good works.

The commander is the Chief operating officer and has a staff of four others to support our efforts. The First Vice Commander is charged with membership, retention, and recruitment.

The Second Vice Commander is responsible for the Post events.

The Adjunct is the corporate secretary and handles all administrative tasks.

The Finance Officer is the responsible for all matters concerning money.

That is a summary of the Post Administrative group and is five of the nine executive committee members. Only eight executives are voting participants, the Commander dose not vote unless we have a tie.

Over the last few years “Be The One” has been actively emphasized what we all should be doing – Being the One for that ONE who really needs us, who needs to know that they are important, that there is HOPE for them, that they are NOT FORGOTTEN, that someone CARES about them. Obviously this is not something new but has been around for a long time. In the below message we see who the first “One” was, is, and will be forever. That “One”, that while our faith in Him may slip or falter, His faith in US never will.

“Many followed Him, and He healed them all ... This was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah: “Behold, My Servant whom I have chosen, My Beloved with whom My soul is well pleased. I will put My Spirit upon Him ... He will not quarrel or cry aloud, nor will anyone hear His voice in the streets; a bruised reed He will not break, and a smoldering wick He will not quench ... and in His Name the Gentiles will hope.” (Matthew 12:15b , 17a, 18a, 20a, 21)

Have you ever seen a candle about to go out? A thin long trail of smoke rises, and there is almost no orange left. In a minute it will be out.

Or think of a reed once someone has stepped on it and crushed it. “Well, that plant isn't coming back,” we say. “Might as well get rid of it.”

There are people like this too—people who are so harmed, so battered by the circumstances of their lives, that we are tempted to give up on them. “After surviving that hell, he'll never find love or friendship.” “I could never live like those people.” “Sick as she is, it would be better if God just took her home.”

But God doesn't think so. Jesus doesn't think so. And in Isaiah's prophecy, God makes this gentle, long-suffering compassion a hallmark of the Messiah. Nobody is too far gone for Him. Nobody is past His mercy, His love, His attention. It doesn't matter who you are or what you have done. Jesus is here for you. His arms are waiting for you—those arms He once stretched out on a cross, for you.” (by Dr. Kari Vo)

Here are the words of “Hope” that we all need, coming from the original “ONE”, but especially for that ONE person that doesn't know where or who to turn to, for that ONE person that may be close to the “Edge”. God has shown us all how to “Be The One” through His caring and Love! What did God do for us by His Love?

“For God so Loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that however believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.” (John 3:16)

THAT is Love! Can we not show at least some of that same Love for someone? All we have to do is to “BE THE ONE”, as God has been for us ALL.

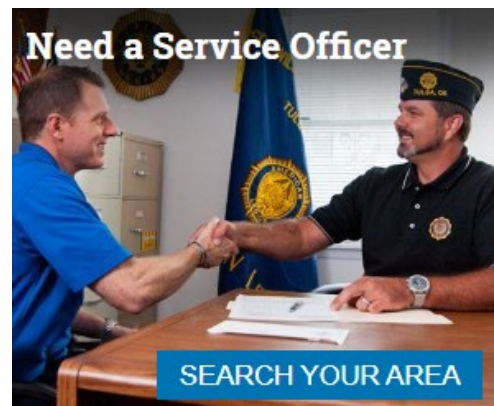

High school students who haven't attended the Boys State and Girls State program before are eligible to apply for Boys State, and Girls State. Selection is based on merit and may vary slightly from state to state.

All programs follow federal disability guidelines, and most require a consent form signed by a parent or guardian and a licensed physician.

In most cases, schools recommend students to their local American Legion post, which then interviews and selects the delegates who will attend.

Please note: Anyone applying for new membership, or that is transferring from the California at large Post 1000, you must submit a copy of your DD-214. Active Duty applicants need to provide a proof of Active Duty. Feel free to black out or redact your Social Security number, we also will return it once your membership is approved. We cannot process or approve either without your DD-214, current military ID or Leave and Earnings Statement. Please remember to write your membership number on your check, or if renewing at the Post write it on the membership renewal and/or application (print CLEARLY), you can always just print a copy of your card and include it.
